SOLENT SHIPPING NEWS - JULY

- The **SHEILDHALL** this month saw her celebrate 70 years after being built in Renfrew, Scotland, by Lobnitz and Company. The Shieldhall was originally designed to transport treated sewage sludge.
- The new 2025 built **JISU FORTUNE** arrived in Southampton on Wednesday 2nd July 2025. Built for Geely Auto of Hong Kong and operated by Geely Jisu Logistics. It set sail on its maiden voyage at the port of Suzhou in eastern China's Jiangsu province on May 22. The ship will carry vehicles to European countries including the UK, the Netherlands and Belgium. JISU FORTUN is the first owned ro-ro vessel of Jisu Logistics, a wholly owned subsidiary of Geely and has an overall length of 199.9 meters, a beam of 38 meters and 7,000 standard loading spaces.
- Another brand new ro-ro also arrived on Sunday 6th July. The BYD HEFEI was built by compatriot Guangzhou Shipbuilding International (GSI), a subsidiary of China State Shipbuilding Corporation (CSSC) and entered service on 7th January 2025. She is the third ship of this class, as of July 2025. The company Build your Dreams (BYD) now has seven of this class in operation.
- The new Neptune Multicat ordered at SeaWork by Williams Shipping will be named WILLDISCOVER, but no date yet confirmed for her August delivery.
- As mentioned by the Captain of SOLENT CAT during the WSS Solent cruise, Williams Shipping will be exporting wind turbine blades regularly from 40/1 berth instead of from Portsmouth. The first ones were recently loaded by **SCOT MARINER** and Williams have quay space available to store up to 100 blades.
- The Damen Shoalbuster 2609 CT PRENTON owned by Carmet Tugs of Eastham alongside at 20/1 berth is just using it as a lay-by berth, while awaiting her next job, having recently completed a contract in the Baltic at Oxelosund in Sweden.

CRUISE SHIP NEWS - JULY

ILMA - made her Inaugural call to the U.K. when she docked in Portsmouth on Tuesday 8th July. She is the 2nd of three super cruise yachts built for the Ritz-Carlton Yacht Collection.

NORWEGIAN JEWEL - is scheduled for a call on the 14th September. She is one of a lovely class of ship in my opinion, a class that was frowned upon when built. It all started when Norwegian Cruise Line was brought by Star Cruises of Hong Kong in 2000. Two ships of the class were already on order for Star Cruises as SUPERSTAR LIBRA & SUPERSTAR SCORPIO. They were both transferred to Norwegian as the NORWEGIAN STAR (II) 2001 & NORWEGIAN DAWN 2002. The ships were a success and a further four units was ordered for delivery 2005-07. The others named; NORWEGIAN JEWEL 2005, NORWEGIAN PEARL 2006, PRIDE OF HAWII 2006 (renamed NORWEGIAN JADE 2008) and NORWEGIAN GEM 2007. In terms of Southampton visitors, DAWN & PEARL both arrived at Southampton during their delivery. The JADE was next to arrive in 2008 and the STAR arrived in 2020. Now the JEWEL will arrive next month! The only ship of the class to not visit the port would be the GEM.

DISNEY FANTASY - is the latest Disney ship to arrive in Southampton. She is based here July-October for a series of cruises. Disney by the end of 2025 will be running a six ship operation *Disney Destiny & Disney Adventure* are due to enter service in November & December respectively this year. Southampton have hosted *Disney Fantasy* in 2020 as well as *Disney Wonder* in 1999, *Disney Magic* 2021 & *Disney Dream* 2023.

CRUISE LINE IN FOCUS - Disney Cruise Line

Incorporated in 1995, prior to this, however, Disney was a licensed partner of Premier Cruise Line from 1985-1993. After this, Disney approached both Carnival and Royal Caribbean; but neither could secure a deal. Originally called Disney Cruise Vacations, a letter of intent was signed in 1995 for the construction of two ships. These two ships would go on to become the most recognisable ships afloat, with their exterior based on a modern "RMS Queen Elizabeth." The two ships sailed for the line for 13 years when two new ships were added to the fleet, and then 10 years later, another class started construction. Six ships in this class have or will be built during the period of 2022-2029. By 2031, the line will have 13 ships! That is, depending on whether the original two are still in the fleet at this stage. A remarkable growth for originally a small line.
