SOLENT SHIPPING NEWS - AUGUST

- UNITED STATES Both the forward and back funnels have been removed and are now on a barge, along with the bridge mast, that will eventually be towed to their resting place to become a museum and dive centre. The ship itself is still being stripped of hazardous materials ready for its deliberate sinking. Still a sad end for one of the greatest if not the greatest liner ever built!
- **ANJI COMMONALITY** Another new ro-ro to sail into the port on the 20th August. One in a series of LNG car carries being built.
- Terminal after a man was suspected of having explosive devices. It soon proved to be nothing of interest. And then in Rotterdam...... As Richard Jolliffe reports: On Sunday 24th August, Extinction Rebellion tried to stop P&O's Ventura docking at the Rotterdam Cruise Terminal. She tried to dock at the Rotterdam Cruise terminal at 1700. It took 1.5 hours to dock, much longer than the press said. The Dutch press said 15 Extinction Rebellion activists tried to stop the 2008 built ship from docking with about 3,000 passengers onboard. The activists used boats and canoes to try and prevent the ship from reaching the quay. The action of the police boats slowly allowed the cruise ship to move forward which spent about 1.5 hours inching alongside the terminal for a movement that should have been over in less than half an hour. The activists want to stop cruise ships visiting the Netherlands saying the Ventura is a floating environmental disaster. From my experience the ship has numerous anti pollution policies in use everywhere and lots of recycling. How much fuel was wasted in the delayed docking? Luckily it hardly affected the passengers.

CRUISE SHIP NEWS - AUGUST

EXPLORA III & EXPLORA IV - both new build ships in 2026 & 2027 will offer a few cruises from Southampton in their respective years.

MAJESTIC PRINCESS - which called at Southampton on the 18th of July, will be based in the port for the summer of 2026 & 2027. Majestic will be the fourth ship of this class to call at Southampton after; *Royal Princess (ii), Regal Princess (ii), Sky Princess (ii)*, and *Enchanted Princess*. To my knowledge, I think *Discovery Princess* is the last of this class to not visit the port, although I do recall maybe a one-off visit. Maybe someone can confirm for next month??

MIEN SCHIFF RELAX - is another maiden call scheduled for next year. Built this year the *Mein Schiff Relax* is part of TUI Cruises InTUItion class of ship, the first new design for them since the arrival of Mien Schiff 3 in 2014. In 2026 she will arrive on Tuesday 27th September and again on Tuesday 3rd November. Let's hope the weather is good in September!

SHIP IN FOCUS - STOCKHOLM (iv) of Swedish America Line.

In June it was announced that one of the world oldest passenger ships the **ASTORIA** was sold for scrap. She had an interesting and eventful career! She left Rotterdam on Thursday 3rd July for her last trip to the scrappers in Ghent, Belgium. Lots of you will know all about her history, but details of the ship's history have are listed below. She is most notably know for the sinking of the Italian State liner ANDREA DORIAN in 1956. She also arrived in Southampton under a few names; VÖLKERFRUNDSHAFT, VÖLKER & ITALIA PRIMA.

VÖLKER	Neptunas Rex Enterprises	(1985-1986)	Laid up in Southampton for a time under this name from December 85 until moved to Oslo, Norway.
FRIDTJOF NANSEN		(1986-1989)	Used as an asylum seekers ship in Oslo.
ITALIA 1	StarLauro S.p.A Napoli (now MSC Cruises)	(1989-1992)	Was to be rebuilt/refurbished for StarLauro under the name SURRENTIO (II) which then was announced as POSITANO she remained laid up.
ITALIA PRIMA	Nina Compagnia di Navigazione S.p.A.	(1992-2005)	1992 purchased from StarLauro for conversion. She called into Southampton in 1994 when "new".

CARIBE	(Charter) Festival Cruises	(2002-2004)	Used for Cuba Cruises it is unknown how many cruises the ship actually operated during this time.
ATHENA	Classic International Cruises	(2005-2012)	Chartered out to many different operators (listed below) during her time as well as cruises for her owners Classic International Cruises.

	(Charter) TravelScope	(2007-2008)	Winter charter October 2007 - January 2008 TravelScope declares bankruptcy in January 2008.
	(Charter) Vision Cruises	(2008-2009)	A Spanish Cruise Line, chartered both ATHENA and ARION from Classic International until they went bankrupt in 2009
	(Charter) Phoenix Reisen	(2009)	May - October, used as an interim vessel.
	(Charter) Page & Moy Cruises	(2010)	Replaced the OCEAN MAJESTY during 2010 this was the company's last season fully charting a ship.
AZORES	Portuscale Cruises	(2013-2015)	Chartered out to many different operators (listed below) during her time as well as cruises for her owners Portuscale Cruises.
	(Charter) Ambiente Kreuzfahrten	(2014)	May-September, poor passenger numbers put stop to the charter.
	(Charter) Cruise & Maritime Voyages	(2014-2015)	Originally chartered as a replacement for DISCOVERY.
ASTORIA	Banco Montepio - Transportes Marítimos	(2016-2021)	Banco Montepio, a Lisbon-based bank through, Island Cruises Transportes Maritimos Unipessoal
	(Charter) Cruise & Maritime Voyages	(2016-2020)	Laid up in 2020 due to COVID but then the bankruptcy of Cruise and Maritime. Mover to Rotterdam in November 2020
	(Charter) Rivers du Monge	(2016-2019)	Summer charter starting May-September
	The Roundtable LLC	(2021-2022)	Owned by Brock Pierce a U.S. entrepreneur that also once owned the FUNCHAL.
	Galloo, Ghent.	(2025)	Left Rotterdam 3rd July, arrived in Ghent on the 9th July. SCRAPPED 2025


